Online Voter Registration; Requires DOS to develop online voter registration system; provides application & security requirements; requires system to compare information submitted online with DHSMV records; provides for disposition of voter registration applications; requires system compliance with federal accessibility provisions; requires division to report to Legislature regarding implementation by specified date. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Property and Casualty Insurance; Restricting to certain property rate filings a requirement that the chief executive officer or chief financial officer and chief actuary of a property insurer certify the information contained in a rate filing; requiring an insurer to employ in certain rate filings actuarial methods, principles, standards, models, or output ranges found by the Florida Commission on Hurricane Loss Projection Methodology to be accurate or reliable in determining probable maximum loss levels, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Division of Insurance Agent and Agency Services; Revises definition of "general lines" agent; revises & creates licensure & examination requirements for general lines agent, personal lines agent, all-lines adjuster, life agent & health agent; revises prelicensure education requirements for insurance agents; revises qualifications for a customer representative's license; requires agents to maintain certain records for specified periods; defines "surrender"; authorizes certain notices of insolvency to be delivered by e-mail. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Informed Patient Consent; Revises conditions for voluntary & informed consent to termination of pregnancy. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Voluntary Contributions to End Breast Cancer; Requiring the application forms for motor vehicle registration and renewal of registration to include language permitting the applicant to make a voluntary contribution to End Breast Cancer to be distributed to a specified organization and used for specified purposes; requiring an application form for a driver license or identification card to include language permitting the applicant to make a voluntary contribution to End Breast Cancer to be distributed to a specified organization, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

Nursing Home Facility Pneumococcal Vaccination Requirements; Requiring a resident of a licensed facility to be assessed for eligibility for pneumococcal vaccination or revaccination by a specified date and, if indicated, to be vaccinated or revaccinated by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

Blanket Health Insurance Eligibility; Revises list of special groups of individuals covered by policy or contract for blanket health insurance. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Public Health Emergencies; Provides enforcement authority relating to public health emergency orders issued by DOH; authorizes DOH to declare, enforce, modify, and abolish isolation of persons, animals, and premises for controlling communicable diseases; requires DOH to establish rules relating to isolation order; prohibits person from falsely claiming to health care provider, or falsely reporting to law enforcement officer, that such person has contracted a communicable disease; provides criminal penalties; specifies that act fulfills important state interest. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/CS/HB 1193 by Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee, Children, Families & Seniors Subcommittee, Ingoglia, Plasencia, Ahern, Broxson, Campbell, Harrison, Hill, Miller, Murphy, Nuñez, Peters, Raschein (Compare SB 1144)

Services for Combat Veterans and Their Families; Requires DCF to establish Florida Combat Veterans' Care Coordination Program to provide combat veterans & their families with behavioral healthcare referral & care coordination services & to contract with managing entities to enter into agreements with Florida 211 Network participants for such services; provides for delivery of services by program teams; requires Florida 211 Network participants to submit certain information to DCF; requires DCF to submit report to Governor & Legislature; provides appropriation. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

HB 1305 by Eagle, Berman, Combee, Peters (Identical SB 996)

Home Medical Equipment Providers; Exempts allopathic, osteopathic, & chiropractic physicians who sell or rent electrostimulation medical equipment from licensure requirements under certain circumstances. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

HB 7137 by Education Committee, **Diaz**, **M.** (Similar CS/SB 1480)

Extracurricular Activities; Providing for periodic review of the Florida High School Athletic Association's performance of its duties; requiring the Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSAA) to adopt guidelines, provide resources, and develop training courses relating to sports ethics; revising academic eligibility requirements; revising insurance requirements to include students who participate in nonathletic extracurricular activities; providing a period within which an audit of a nonprofit association's records must be provided to the Auditor General, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

SB 446 by Bradley (Compare CS/CS/HB 759)

Florida College System Boards of Trustees; Revising the membership requirements for the Florida College System institution boards of trustees; requiring the St. Johns River State College board to have a specified number of trustees; providing for staggered terms of board members, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

The Beirut Memorial; Requires Capitol Complex memorial garden to include monument to members of U.S. Armed Forces who lost their lives in Beirut, Lebanon, on specified date. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Designated Areas for Skateboarding, Inline Skating, Paintball, or Freestyle or Mountain and Off-roading

Bicycling; Deleting the requirement that a governmental entity that provides a designated area for skateboarding, inline skating, or freestyle bicycling obtain the written consent of the parent or legal guardian of a child under a certain age before allowing the child to participate in these activities in such area; requiring the governmental entity to post a rule indicating that consent forms are required for children under a certain age before participation in paintball or mountain and off-road bicycling, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

CS/CS/HB 373 by Regulatory Affairs Committee, Government Operations Appropriations Subcommittee, Raulerson, Bileca, Richardson, Stevenson (Identical CS/SB 636)

Public Accountancy; Revises definition of term "licensed audit firm"; revises practice requirements for partnerships, corporations, & limited liability companies; revises provisions relating to licensure of firms & public accounting firms; revises definition of term "quality review" to include peer review. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

SB 522 by Brandes (Identical HB 4007)

Division of Bond Finance; Deleting a requirement that the division issue a regular newsletter to certain parties which addresses local and state bonds, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

HB 4043 by Geller, Murphy, Stark (Identical SB 840)

Write-in Candidates; Repeals requirement that write-in candidate reside within district represented by office sought at time of qualification. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

CS/SB 620 by Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Richter (Similar HB 7007)

Emergency Management; Exempting certain employees from specified travel expense provisions when traveling under the Emergency Management Assistance Compact under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Read second time April 21

CS/HB 7021 by State Affairs Committee, Agriculture & Natural Resources Subcommittee, Sullivan, Trumbull, Artiles (Similar CS/CS/SB 680, Compare HB 241)

Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission; Authorizing citizen support organizations to receive funds from the commission if the organization provides services by contract under certain circumstances; revising the time period for which

tarpon tags are valid; removing criteria for issuance of restricted species endorsements on saltwater products licenses; removing provisions authorizing the commission to limit the number of participants engaged in the taking of alligators or their eggs; providing penalties for the feeding of wildlife and freshwater fish, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

CS/HB 565 by Government Operations Subcommittee, Beshears (Similar CS/SB 1054)

Retirement; Authorizes local agency employers to reassess designation of positions for inclusion in SMS Class; provides for removal of certain positions. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

HB 553 by Perry (Similar SB 434)

Public Libraries; Revises composition & duties of State Library Council; revises powers & duties of DOS' Division of Library & Information Services; requires division to coordinate with DOE's Division of Blind Services to provide certain services; authorizes division to issue electronic information; revises provisions regarding delivery & distribution of publications; requires specified entities in state government to designate state publications liaison; revises duties of division with respect to management of State Publications Program; removes provision requiring division to provide centralized microfilming program for state agencies. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/SB 264 by Fiscal Policy, Bradley, Brandes (Identical CS/HB 421)

Traffic Enforcement Agencies and Traffic Citations; Designating counties and municipalities as traffic enforcement agencies for purposes of the section and prohibiting them from establishing traffic citation quotas; requiring a county or municipality to submit a report of its traffic citation revenue and its expenses for operating a law enforcement agency during a fiscal year to the Legislative Auditing Committee under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

CS/SB 466 by Regulated Industries, Flores (Similar CS/HB 413)

Low-voltage Alarm Systems; Revising the definition of the term "low-voltage alarm system project" and adding the definition of the term "wireless alarm system"; providing that a permit is not required to install, maintain, inspect, replace, or service a wireless alarm system and its ancillary components;

prohibiting a local enforcement agency from requiring the payment of any additional fees, charges, or expenses associated with the installation or replacement of a new or existing alarm system, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

CS/SB 160 by Fiscal Policy, Evers (Similar HB 409)

Rural Letter Carriers; Exempting a rural letter carrier of the United States Postal Service from safety belt usage requirements while performing his or her duties on a designated postal route, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/HB 401 by Business & Professions Subcommittee, **Magar** (Identical SB 558)

Public Lodging & Public Food Service Establishments;

Revises frequency at which Division of Hotels and Restaurants of DBPR must reassess inspection frequency of public food service establishments; revises DBPR's duties with respect to distribution of specified food-recovery brochure; deletes restriction on length of time that licensed public food service establishment may operate at temporary food service event; authorizes division to deliver lodging inspection reports & food service inspection reports electronically; requires operators of public food service establishments to maintain copies of food service inspection reports & make them available to division; revises certain delinquent fees for license renewal. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/SB 132 by Transportation, Joyner, Dean, Abruzzo, Altman (Similar CS/HB 51)

Disabled Parking Permits; Authorizing certain veterans to provide the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles alternative documentation for renewal or replacement of a disabled parking permit, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

Read second time April 21

SB 184 by Evers, Gaetz (Identical HB 109, Compare HB 1161)

Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot; Authorizing absent uniformed services voters and overseas voters to use the federal write-in absentee ballot in any state or local election; prohibiting the supervisor of elections from canvassing federal write-in absentee ballots from overseas voters in certain elections until 10 days after the date of the election; revising minimum requirements for Department of State rules used to determine what constitutes a valid vote on a federal write-in absentee ballot, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

Read second time April 21

HB 7023 by Rulemaking Oversight & Repeal Subcommittee, Ray (Similar SB 7056)
