HB 7143 by State Affairs Committee, Caldwell, Passidomo, Williams, A., Watson, C. (Similar HB 227, CS/CS/SB 228, Compare HB 1161, SB 7064)

Online Voter Registration; Requires DOS to develop online voter registration system; provides application & security requirements; requires system to compare information submitted online with DHSMV records; provides for disposition of voter registration applications; requires system compliance with federal accessibility provisions; requires division to report to Legislature regarding implementation by specified date. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/CS/CS/HB 383 by Judiciary Committee, Local Government Affairs Subcommittee, Civil Justice Subcommittee, Edwards, Perry, Artiles, Baxley, Burton, Campbell, Combee, Cummings, Drake, Eagle, Gaetz, Mayfield, Pilon, Porter, Smith, Spano, Steube, Van Zant, Wood (Similar CS/CS/SB 284)

Private Property Rights; Providing that any settlement agreement reached between an owner and a governmental entity applies so long as the agreement resolves all issues; authorizing a property owner to bring an action to recover damages caused by a prohibited exaction; specifying that an action for a prohibited exaction is not to be construed in pari materia with certain other actions, etc. Effective Date: October 1, 2015

CS/CS/CS/HB 435 by State Affairs Committee, Government Operations Appropriations Subcommittee, Rulemaking Oversight & Repeal Subcommittee, Adkins (Similar CS/SB 718)

Administrative Procedures; Providing procedures for agencies to follow when initiating rulemaking after certain public hearings; limiting reliance upon an unadopted rule in certain circumstances; providing for publication of notices of rule development and of rules filed for adoption; conforming proceedings that oppose agency action based on an invalid or unadopted rule to proceedings used for challenging rules, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/HB 733 by Agriculture & Natural Resources Subcommittee, Ray, Ahern, Burgess, Pilon, Raburn, Sprowls (Compare CS/CS/SB 314)

Petroleum Restoration Program; Renames low-score site initiative as low-risk site initiative; requires that responsible parties provide evidence of authorization from property owners to conduct site rehabilitation; requires that such responsible parties & property owners submit certain proposals for voluntary participation in low-risk initiative; increases total amount of costs DEP is authorized to approve for each site; authorizes DEP to approve certain costs; requires DEP to procure certain contractual services for completion of certain work; extends period for completion of assessment & limited remediation work; provides an additional extension for certain groundwater monitoring under certain conditions; requires that DEP issue site rehabilitation completion order incorporating proposals for no further action upon certain demonstration; provides that certain discharges do not alter eligibility for state-funded rehabilitation;

reduces number of sites necessary to meet the eligibility requirement for advanced cleanup application; requires that certain applicants provide evidence of authorization from property owners as part of such application; increases total amount for which DEP may contract for advanced cleanup work in fiscal year. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Local Government Construction Preferences; Prohibiting local ordinances and regulations from restricting competition for the award of a contract for construction services based upon certain conditions; requiring a state college, county, municipality, school district, or other political subdivision of the state to make specified disclosures in competitive solicitation documents, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

SB 7032 by Health Policy (Similar HB 7129)

Public Records/Reports of a Deceased Child; Removing the public records exemption for information held by the State Child Abuse Death Review Committee or a local committee that reveals the identity of family members or others living in the home of a child whose death occurred as a result of a verified report of abuse or neglect; exempting information held by the State Child Abuse Death Review Committee or a local committee that identifies a deceased child whose death is reported to the central abuse hotline but whose death is not the result of abuse or neglect and the identity of the surviving siblings, family members, or others living in the home of such a deceased child; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption under the Open Government Sunset Review Act; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/SB 200 by Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Latvala (Similar CS/HB 179)

Public Records/E-mail Addresses/Tax Notices; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for e-mail addresses obtained by a tax collector for the purpose of electronically sending certain tax notices or obtaining the consent of a taxpayer for electronic transmission of certain tax notices; providing for future review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

SB 7028 by Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security (Similar CS/HB 35)

Educational Opportunities for Veterans; Revising criteria for eligibility for out-of-state fee waivers at state universities, Florida College System institutions, and specified career centers; removing a provision regarding the applicability of waivers to required credit hours for a student's degree or certificate program, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Environmental Control; Authorizing the use of land set-asides and land use modifications, including constructed wetlands or other water quality improvement projects, in water quality credit trading; providing an appropriation; directing the department or the water management district governing boards to adopt and implement certain recovery or prevention strategies concurrent with the adoption of minimum flows and minimum water levels; requiring the department to initiate assessments of Outstanding Florida Springs by a certain date, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Students with Disabilities; Revising the duties of the Auditor General to include annual audits of educational fiscal intermediaries; revising definitions applicable to the Florida Personal Learning Scholarship Accounts Program; requiring the Florida Prepaid College Board to create certain procedures; authorizing a prepaid college plan or a college savings plan to be

purchased, accounted for, used, and terminated under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Postsecondary Access and Affordability; Revises provisions relating to apprenticeships, postsecondary tuition & fees, tuition differentials, career education, textbooks & instructional materials, & Higher Education Coordinating Council; creates Florida Apprenticeship Grant Program & Rapid Response Education & Training Program; provides requirements for programs. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/HB 7017 by Education Appropriations Subcommittee, Education Committee, O'Toole, Artiles (Compare CS/CS/SB 7006)

Early Learning; Includes large family child care homes in local zoning regulation requirements; revises certain minimum standards for child care facilities & requirements for certain personnel; provides for inspection of programs regulated by DCF; provides exemptions from child care facility licensing standards; revises restrictions on residential property insurance coverage to include coverage for large family child care homes & Child Care Executive Partnership; provides OEL with authority to allocate certain funds. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Literacy Jump Start Pilot Project; Requires Office of Early Learning to establish pilot project in St. Lucie County to assist low-income, at-risk children in developing emergent literacy skills; requires OEL to select organization to implement pilot project; provides eligibility requirements for participation; requires background screening for childcare personnel; requires OEL to allocate funds for pilot project. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/CS/HB 817 by Economic Affairs Committee, Transportation & Ports Subcommittee, Gaetz, Avila, Hager, Plakon, Steube, Trumbull (Compare SB 1326)

Transportation Network Companies; Provides requirements for operating as a transportation network company or operating as a transportation network driver. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/HB 7067 by Economic Affairs Committee, Economic Development & Tourism Subcommittee, La Rosa (Compare CS/HB 63, HB 903, HB 5401, CS/CS/CS/SB 824, CS/SB 1214, SB 1556)

Economic Development; Revises requirements of state & local governments relating to transportation concurrency & impact fees & economic development incentives including Capital Investment Tax Credit, defense contractor & space flight business tax refund program, qualified target industry program, high-impact businesses, Quick Action Closing Fund, Innovation Incentive Program, and brownfield redevelopment; repeals funding relating to certain entertainment facilities; provides requirements for EFI; revises authority of FDFC; creates Startup Florida Initiative; establishes local enterprise zone program; provides for DEO certification & redesignates specified enterprise zones as certified enterprise zones. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/SB 7018 by Appropriations, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Similar CS/CS/HB 293, Compare CS/CS/HB 1001, CS/CS/SB 382, SB 654)

State Ombudsman Program; Revising legislative intent with respect to citizen ombudsmen; deleting references to ombudsman councils and transferring their responsibilities to representatives of the State Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program; revising the duties and authority of the state ombudsman; requiring the state ombudsman to designate and direct program districts; providing conditions under which a representative of the program could be found to have a conflict of interest, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

CS/SB 642 by Banking and Insurance, Benacquisto, Sobel (Similar CS/HB 935, Compare HB 937, CS/CS/HB 939)

Individuals with Disabilities; Creating the "Florida Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) Act"; requiring the Florida Prepaid College Board to establish a direct-support organization known as "Florida ABLE, Inc."; authorizing the organization to use certain services, property, and facilities of the Florida Prepaid College Board; requiring the Agency for Health Care Administration, the Agency for Persons with Disabilities, the

Department of Children and Families, and the Department of Education to assist, cooperate, and coordinate with the organization in the provision of public information and outreach for the program, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/CS/SB 644 by Appropriations, Banking and Insurance, Benacquisto (Similar HB 937, Compare CS/HB 935)

Florida ABLE Program Trust Fund/State Board of Administration; Creating the Florida ABLE Program Trust Fund within the State Board of Administration; authorizing sources of funds; specifying the purpose of the trust fund and authorized uses of the assets; providing for future review and termination or re-creation of the trust fund; providing a directive to the Division of Law Revision and Information, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 642 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

CS/CS/SB 646 by Appropriations, Banking and Insurance, Benacquisto (Similar CS/CS/HB 939, Compare CS/HB 935)

Public Records/Information Held by the Florida Prepaid College Board, the Florida ABLE, Inc., and the Florida ABLE program; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for certain personal financial and health information held by the Florida Prepaid College Board, the Florida ABLE, Inc., or the Florida ABLE program, or an agent or service provider thereof; authorizing the release of such information under specified circumstances; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 642 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

Membership Associations; Defining the term "membership association"; requiring a membership association to file an annual report with the Legislature; specifying required elements of the report; prohibiting a membership association from expending moneys received from public funds on litigation against the state; requiring certain membership association dues to be assessed for each specified public officer; providing conditions for nonpayment of dues, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

SB 728 by Benacquisto (Similar CS/HB 1021)

Health Insurance Coverage for Opioids; Providing that a health insurance policy that covers opioid analgesic drug products may impose a prior authorization requirement for an abuse-deterrent opioid analgesic drug product only if the insurer imposes the same requirement for each opioid analgesic drug product without an abuse-deterrence labeling claim; prohibiting such health insurance policy from requiring use of an opioid analgesic drug product without an abuse-deterrence labeling claim before providing coverage for an abuse-deterrent opioid analgesic drug product, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2016

CS/CS/SB 1216 by Fiscal Policy, Community Affairs, Simpson (Compare HB 579, HB 873, CS/CS/CS/HB 933, HB 973, HB 1159, CS/HB 7067, SB 404, CS/SB 484, SB 562, CS/SB 832)

Community Development; Declaring that there is a compelling state interest in enabling property owners to voluntarily finance certain improvements to property damaged by sinkhole activity with local government assistance; subdividing the state into specified geographic regions for the purpose of regional comprehensive planning, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/HB 3505 by Civil Justice Subcommittee, Steube
(Identical SB 44)

Relief/Estate of Lazaro Rodriguez/City of Hialeah; Provides appropriation to compensate Estate of Lazaro Rodriguez & his legal survivors for injuries sustained as result of negligence of City of Hialeah; provides limitation on payment of fees & costs; provides that appropriation settles all present & future claims related to wrongful death of Lazaro Rodriguez. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

(Identical CS/SB 36)
