HB 7143 by State Affairs Committee, Caldwell, Passidomo, Williams, A., Watson, C. (Similar HB 227, CS/CS/SB 228, Compare HB 1161, SB 7064)

Online Voter Registration; Requires DOS to develop online voter registration system; provides application & security requirements; requires system to compare information submitted online with DHSMV records; provides for disposition of voter registration applications; requires system compliance with federal accessibility provisions; requires division to report to Legislature regarding implementation by specified date. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/CS/HB 817 by Economic Affairs Committee, Transportation & Ports Subcommittee, Gaetz, Avila, Hager, Plakon, Renner, Steube, Trumbull (Compare SB 1326)

**Transportation Network Companies;** Provides requirements for operating as a transportation network company or operating as a transportation network company driver. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

SB 728 by Benacquisto (Similar CS/HB 1021)

**Health Insurance Coverage for Opioids;** Providing that a health insurance policy that covers opioid analysesic drug products may impose a prior authorization requirement for an

abuse-deterrent opioid analgesic drug product only if the insurer imposes the same requirement for each opioid analgesic drug product without an abuse-deterrence labeling claim; prohibiting such health insurance policy from requiring use of an opioid analgesic drug product without an abuse-deterrence labeling claim before providing coverage for an abuse-deterrent opioid analgesic drug product, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2016

Pub. Rec./High-Pressure Well Stimulation Chemical Disclosure Registry; Provides exemption from public records requirements for proprietary business information contained within information relating to high-pressure well stimulations obtained by DEP in connection with DEP's online high-pressure well stimulation chemical disclosure registry; provides procedures & requirements with respect to granting of confidential & exempt status; provides for disclosure under specified circumstances; provides for future review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity; provides for contingent effect. Effective Date: on the same date that CS/HB 1205 or similar legislation takes effect

# **CS/SB 682 by Appropriations**, **Grimsley** (Similar CS/HB 111)

Transitional Living Facilities; Providing requirements for transitional living facility policies and procedures governing client admission, transfer, and discharge; prohibiting a licensee or employee of a facility from serving notice upon a client to leave the premises or taking other retaliatory action under certain circumstances; providing a penalty for certain misuse of a client's personal funds, property, or personal needs allowance; requiring the agency, the Department of Health, the Agency for Persons with Disabilities, and the Department of Children and Families to develop electronic information systems for certain purposes, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2015

# CS/CS/SB 908 by Criminal Justice, Transportation, Altman, Gibson (Compare CS/CS/CS/HB 231)

**Traffic Safety;** Revising provisions relating to the passing of a vehicle; prohibiting passing and turning in front of a vulnerable user in an unsafe manner; providing penalties; providing fines and penalties for specified infractions contributing to bodily injury of a vulnerable user; requiring a hearing for specified offenses, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2015

# CS/CS/SB 596 by Commerce and Tourism, Regulated Industries, Hays (Similar CS/CS/HB 263, Compare CS/HB 301, CS/CS/SB 186)

Craft Distilleries; Defining the term "branded product"; revising the current limitation on the number of containers that may be sold to consumers by craft distilleries; applying such limitation to individual containers for each branded product; prohibiting a craft distillery from shipping or arranging to ship any of its distilled spirits to consumers; requiring the Department of Transportation to install directional signs at specified locations in accordance with Florida's Highway Guide Sign Program upon the request of a craft distillery licensed in this state, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

# **CS/SB 954 by Fiscal Policy**, **Garcia** (Compare HB 291, CS/CS/SB 7070)

**Involuntary Examinations of Minors;** Requiring school health services plans to include notification requirements when a student is removed from school, school transportation, or a school-sponsored activity for involuntary examination; including health care surrogates and proxies as individuals who may act on behalf of an individual involuntarily admitted to a facility; requiring a receiving facility to immediately notify the parent, guardian, caregiver, or guardian advocate of the

whereabouts of a minor who is being held for involuntary examination; providing circumstances when notification may be delayed, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

## CS/CS/SB 872 by Banking and Insurance, Judiciary, Hukill (Similar CS/CS/CS/HB 343)

**Estates;** Authorizing the court, if costs and attorney fees are to be paid from the estate under specified sections of law, to direct payment from a certain part of the estate or, under specified circumstances, to direct payment from a trust; requiring a personal representative to be removed and the letters of administration revoked if he or she was not qualified to act at the time of appointment; providing that a governing instrument may not direct that taxes be paid from property other than property passing under the governing instrument, except under specified conditions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

## CS/SB 526 by Commerce and Tourism, Grimsley (Identical CS/HB 523, Compare HB 513)

**Notaries Public;** Revising the methods available for verifying documents; defining the term "reliable electronic means"; authorizing specified officers to administer oaths by reliable electronic means when engaged in the performance of official duties, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

# CS/CS/SB 420 by Appropriations, Community Affairs, Grimsley (Similar CS/CS/HB 627)

Animal Control; Providing a procedure for adopting or humanely disposing of impounded stray livestock, except cattle, as an alternative to sale or auction; requiring a county animal control center to establish fees and be responsible for damages caused while impounding livestock; authorizing certain municipal animal control officers to take custody of an animal found neglected or cruelly treated or to order the owner of such an animal to provide certain care at the owner's expense, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

# CS/CS/SB 766 by Appropriations, Judiciary, Hukill (Similar CS/CS/CS/HB 649, Compare HB 979, CS/SB 1178)

**Surveillance by a Drone;** Prohibiting a person, a state agency, or a political subdivision from using a drone to capture an image of privately owned real property or of the owner, tenant, occupant, invitee, or licensee of such property with the intent to conduct surveillance without his or her written consent if a reasonable expectation of privacy exists; authorizing the use of a

drone by a person or entity engaged in a business or profession licensed by the state in certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

CS/CS/SB 278 by Appropriations, Finance and Tax, Diaz de la Portilla (Similar CS/HB 833)

**Downtown Development Districts;** Authorizing municipalities larger than a certain population and located in certain counties to levy an ad valorem tax on real and personal property in downtown development districts, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

**CS/SB 904 by Health Policy, Bean** (Identical CS/CS/HB 1039)

Home Health Services; Allowing home health agencies to operate related offices inside of the main office's health service planning district without an additional license; providing for the licensure of more than one nurse registry operational site within the same health service planning district; authorizing a licensed nurse registry to operate a satellite office; requiring a nurse registry operational site to keep all original records; requiring a nurse registry to provide notice and certain evidence before it relocates an operational site or opens a satellite office, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

CS/CS/SB 1024 by Fiscal Policy, Transportation, Simmons (Similar CS/HB 1101, Compare CS/CS/HB 7075)

Central Florida Expressway Authority; Requiring the chairs of the boards of specified county commissions each to appoint one member from their respective counties who is a commission member or chair or a county mayor to serve on the governing body of the authority; specifying that the Central Florida Expressway Authority is a party to a certain lease-purchase agreement between the department and the Orlando-Orange County Expressway Authority; removing the requirement that title in fee simple absolute to the former Orlando-Orange County Expressway System be transferred to the state upon the completion of the faithful performance and termination of a specified lease-purchase agreement, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

Public Records/E-mail Addresses/Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for e- mail addresses collected by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; providing for future review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

Public Records and Meetings/Trade Secrets; Expanding public records exemptions for certain data processing software obtained by an agency, certain information held by a county tourism promotion agency, information related to trade secrets held by specified entities, and specified data, programs, or supporting documentation held by an agency; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemptions; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 564 or similar legislation relating to trade secrets takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

**Pub. Effective Date: on the same date that CS/CS/HB 91 or similar legislation relating to trade secrets takes effect

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## SB 462 by Lee (Similar CS/HB 503)

Family Law; Providing that a collaborative law process commences when the parties enter into a collaborative law participation agreement; prohibiting a tribunal from ordering a party to participate in a collaborative law process over the party's objection; providing for confidentiality of communications made during the collaborative law process, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2015

Family Law; Designates act as "Collaborative Law Process Act"; provides that collaborative law process commences when parties enter into collaborative law participation agreement; prohibits tribunal from ordering party to participate in collaborative law process over party's objection; provides conditions under which collaborative law process concludes, terminates, or continues; provides for confidentiality of communications made during collaborative law process; provides exceptions; provides that specified provisions do not take effect until 30 days after Florida Supreme Court adopts rules of procedure & professional responsibility. **Residential Properties;** Revising requirements relating to the issuance of an estoppel certificate to specified persons; requiring that an estoppel certificate contain certain information; providing an effective period for a certificate based upon the date of issuance and form of delivery, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

CS/CS/CS/HB 611 by Judiciary Committee, Business & Professions Subcommittee, Civil Justice Subcommittee, Wood, Artiles, Eagle, Mayfield, Raburn, Spano (Similar CS/CS/CS/SB 736)

Residential Properties; Revises requirements relating to issuance of estoppel certificate to specified persons; requires that estoppel certificate contain certain information; provides effective period for certificate based upon date of issuance & form of delivery; provides that association waives specified claim against person or such person's successors or assigns who rely on certificate in good faith; authorizes summary proceeding to be brought to compel association to prepare or deliver estoppel certificate; specifies maximum amounts association may charge for estoppel certificate; provides that authority to charge fee for estoppel certificate must be established by specified written resolution or provided by written management, bookkeeping, or maintenance contract. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

**Utility Projects;** Creating the "Utility Cost Containment Bond Act"; authorizing certain local government entities to finance the costs of a utility project by issuing utility cost containment bonds upon application by a local agency; authorizing an authority to issue utility cost containment bonds for specified purposes related to utility projects; requiring the local agency or its publicly owned utility to collect the utility project charge, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

CS/CS/HB 617 by Regulatory Affairs Committee, Finance & Tax Committee, Goodson, Sprowls (Similar CS/CS/SB 1102)

**Utility Projects;** Authorizes certain local agencies to apply to authority to finance costs of certain utility projects by issuing utility cost containment bonds; provides criteria in applying to authority; provides criteria of drafting financing resolution; provides procedures to establish or adjust utility projects; provides requirements for collection of project charges; specifies legal status of project charges for securing payment of bonds; specifies payment obligations & legal status of utility cost containment bonds. **Property and Casualty Insurance;** Authorizing flexible flood insurance; deleting a provision that prohibits supplemental flood insurance from including excess coverage over any other insurance covering the peril of flood; authorizing domestic reciprocal insurers to return a portion of unassigned funds to their subscribers; providing limitations, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

HB 677 by Santiago (Compare CS/SB 678)

**Reciprocal Insurers**; Authorizes domestic reciprocal insurer to return portion of unassigned funds to subscribers; provides limitations. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

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CS/CS/SB 798 by Appropriations, Commerce and Tourism. Lee (Similar CS/CS/HB 765)

**Household Moving Services;** Removing a prohibition that precludes a mover from limiting its liability for the loss or damage of household goods to a specified valuation rate; requiring a mover to conduct a physical survey and provide a binding estimate in certain circumstances unless waived by the shipper, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2015

Household Moving Services; Requires movers to conduct physical surveys & provide disclosures & binding estimates; provides for certain waivers; provides that failure to comply with certain provisions violates ch. 507, F.S.; provides criminal penalties; requires DACS to adopt rules & prepare publication regarding rights & responsibilities of, & remedies available to, movers & shippers. Effective Date: July 1, 2015
