HB 193 by Broxson, Baxley, Harrell, Moskowitz, Peters, Rouson, Van Zant (Identical SB 164)

Crime Stoppers Trust Fund; Authorizes county that is awarded grant from trust fund to use such funds for purchase & distribution of promotional items. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

HB 213 by Moraitis (Identical SB 266)

Property Appraisers; Provides that property appraiser's budget shall be funded once DOR makes its final budget amendments; obligates county commission to fund DOR's final property appraiser budget during pendency of appeal to Administration Commission. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Finance & Tax Committee: Favorable; Local & Federal Affairs Committee: Favorable

CS/CS/HB 217 by Regulatory Affairs Committee, Business & Professions Subcommittee, Van Zant, Ahern, Geller, Plasencia, Rouson (Compare SB 338)

Engineers; Prohibits person who is not licensed as engineer or structural engineer from using specified names & titles or practicing engineering or structural engineering; exempts certain persons from licensing requirements; establishes various fees for examination & licensure of structural engineers; provides licensure & application requirements for structural engineer license; exempts under certain conditions structural engineer who applies for licensure before specified date from passage of certain national examination; requires board to certify certain applicants for licensure by endorsement; prohibits specified persons from using specified names & titles; provides various acts which constitute grounds for disciplinary action against structural engineer, to which penalties apply. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

HB 241 by Trumbull, Perry, Rooney (Compare SB 680)

Personal Flotation Devices; Requires that personal flotation devices be used in accordance with the U.S. Coast Guard approval label during operation of certain vessels or personal watercraft or while engaged in water skiing, parasailing, aquaplaning, & similar activities. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Highway & Waterway Safety Subcommittee: Favorable; Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable

CS/HB 243 by Health Quality Subcommittee, Roberson, K., Baxley (Similar CS/SB 640)

Vital Statistics; Revises duties & responsibilities of DOH with respect to production & maintenance of death certificates & burial transit permits; requires electronic filing & transmission of certain death records. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Health Quality Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Health & Human Services Committee: Favorable

HB 257 by Ray (Identical SB 956)

Freight Logistics Zones; Defines "freight logistics zone"; authorizes county or two or more contiguous counties to designate geographic area or areas within its jurisdiction as freight logistics zone; requires adoption of strategic plan which must include certain information; provides that certain projects within freight logistics zones may be eligible for priority in state funding & certain incentive programs; provides evaluation criteria for freight logistics zones. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/HB 273 by Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Perry (Similar CS/CS/SB 202, Compare CS/HB 165, CS/SB 258)

Insurer Notifications; Authorizes policyholder of personal lines insurance to elect delivery of policy documents by electronic means; defines "optional coverage"; revises requirements applicable to insurers when providing notice of change in policy terms for renewal policy to include requirement that notice be an advance notice; authorizes such notice to be sent separately from notice of renewal premium within specified timeframe; requires insurer to provide sample copy of notice of change in policy terms to insurance agent at specified time; prohibits use of such notice to add optional coverage that increases policy's premium unless policyholder approves additional optional coverage. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/HB 4011 by Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Goodson (Similar CS/CS/SB 234)

Motor Vehicle Insurance; Revises terms "motor vehicle insurance" & "policy" to remove exclusions for policies that insure more than four automobiles from provisions regulating insurance rates & cancellation or nonrenewal of motor vehicle insurance contracts. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

HB 7001 by Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Trujillo, Moskowitz (Compare CS/SB 542)

Intercepting and Recording Oral Communications; Provides that it is lawful to intercept & record certain oral communications. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

HB 7005 by Government Operations Subcommittee, Ingoglia (Similar SB 7004)

OGSR/Commission for Independent Education; Removes scheduled repeal of exemptions from public records & public meeting requirements for records of investigations conducted by Commission for Independent Education, discussions of such investigatory records at probable cause panel meetings, & recordings, minutes, & findings from closed portions of such meetings. Effective Date: October 1, 2015

HB 7007 by Economic Development & Tourism Subcommittee, Eagle (Similar CS/SB 620)

Emergency Management; Exempts state employees from specified travel expense provisions when traveling under Emergency Management Assistance Compact pursuant to request for assistance from another state under certain circumstances. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

HB 7009 by Finance & Tax Committee, Sullivan

Corporate Income Tax; Adopts 2015 version of Internal Revenue Code; incorporates reference to recent federal act into state law for purpose of defining "adjusted federal income"; revises treatment by this state of certain depreciation & expensing of assets that are allowed for federal income tax purposes; authorizes DOR to adopt emergency rules; provides retroactive applicability. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Offenses Concerning Racketeering and Illegal Debts; Authorizes investigative agency to institute civil proceeding for forfeiture in circuit court in certain circumstances; revises grounds for an action; authorizes court to order forfeiture of other property of defendant up to value of unavailable property in certain circumstances; authorizes DLA to bring an action for certain violations; provides for civil penalties for natural persons & other persons; authorizes party to specific civil action to petition for entry of consent decree or settlement agreement & provides requirements; revises provisions relating to subpoena confidentiality; provides that investigative agency has authority to stipulate to protective orders with respect to documents & information submitted in response to subpoena; provides for distribution of forfeiture proceeds to victims.
