Public Health Emergencies; Provides enforcement authority relating to public health emergency orders issued by DOH; authorizes DOH to declare, enforce, modify, and abolish isolation of persons, animals, and premises for controlling communicable diseases; requires DOH to establish rules relating to isolation order; prohibits person from falsely claiming to health care provider, or falsely reporting to law enforcement officer, that such person has contracted a communicable disease;

provides criminal penalties; specifies that act fulfills important state interest. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

HB 7007 by Economic Development & Tourism Subcommittee, Eagle (Similar CS/SB 620)

Emergency Management; Exempts state employees from specified travel expense provisions when traveling under Emergency Management Assistance Compact pursuant to request for assistance from another state under certain circumstances. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

CS/HB 7017 by Education Appropriations Subcommittee, Education Committee, O'Toole (Compare CS/SB 7006)

Early Learning; Includes large family child care homes in local zoning regulation requirements; revises certain minimum standards for child care facilities & requirements for certain personnel; provides for inspection of programs regulated by DCF; provides exemptions from child care facility licensing standards; revises restrictions on residential property insurance coverage to include coverage for large family child care homes & Child Care Executive Partnership; provides OEL with authority to allocate certain funds. Effective Date: July 1, 2015
