

Closing the Gap Grant Program; Adds priority area for project proposals under Closing the Gap grant program to address racial & ethnic disparities in morbidity & mortality rates relating to sickle cell disease. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Substance Abuse Services; Requires DCF to create voluntary certification program for recovery residences; requires DCF to approve credentialing entities to develop & administer certification program; requires background screening of recovery residence employees; provides for denial, suspension, or revocation of certification; directs DCF to approve at least one credentialing entity by specified date to develop & administer certification program; requires DCF to publish list on its website. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Children, Families & Seniors Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Health & Human Services Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

CS/HB 27 by Highway & Waterway Safety Subcommittee, Gaetz, Artiles, Campbell, Costello, Ingoglia, Perry, Santiago (Similar CS/SB 240, SB 1398)

**Driver Licenses & Identification Cards**; Provides for DHSMV to accept military identification card to meet certain requirements for issuance of driver license or identification card; authorizes word "Veteran" to be exhibited on driver license or identification card of veteran. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Highway & Waterway Safety Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Veteran & Military Affairs Subcommittee: Favorable; Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable

**CS/HB 43** by Health & Human Services Committee, Nuñez (Similar CS/CS/SB 296)

**Diabetes Advisory Council;** Requires Diabetes Advisory Council, in conjunction with DOH, AHCA, & DMS, to develop plans relating to diabetes management, treatment, & control; requires report to Governor & Legislature; revises council membership. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Health Quality Subcommittee: Favorable; Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Health & Human Services Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute CS/HB 71 by Judiciary Committee, Smith, Harrell, Sprowls, Watson, C. (Similar SB 414)

Service Animals; Requires public accommodation to permit use of service animal by individual with disability; provides conditions for public accommodation to exclude or remove service animal; revises penalties for certain persons or entities who interfere with use of service animal; provides penalty for knowing & willful misrepresentation with respect to use or training of service animal. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Government Operations Subcommittee: Favorable; Judiciary Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; State Affairs Committee: Favorable

**CS/HB 79** by Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee, Cummings (Similar SB 340, Compare HB 1277, SB 1462, SB 1476)

Crisis Stabilization Services; Requires DCF to develop standards & protocols for collection, storage, transmittal, & analysis of utilization data from public receiving facilities; requires compliance by managing entities by specified date; requires DCF to create statewide database; provides appropriation. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Children, Families & Seniors Subcommittee: Favorable; Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Health & Human Services Committee: Favorable

**CS/HB 111 by Health Innovation Subcommittee, Magar** (Similar SB 682)

**Transitional Living Facilities;** Creates part XI, ch. 400, F.S., relating to transitional living facilities; provides requirements with respect to licensure, policies & procedures, client admission & care, screening of employees, recordkeeping, & safekeeping of client property & funds; provides penalties for violations. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Health Innovation Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Health & Human Services Committee: Favorable

HB 143 by Bileca, Baxley, Combee, Cortes, B., Costello, Cummings, Diaz, M., Gaetz, Harrell, Hill, Perry, Pilon, Rouson, Spano, Stone, Van Zant, Wood (Similar SB 352)

American Founders' Month; Designates September as "American Founders' Month"; authorizes Governor to annually designate month; requires district school boards to celebrate American Founders by observing American Founders' Month; provides that instruction may be integrated into existing school curriculum. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

K-12 Subcommittee: Favorable; Education Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Education Committee: Favorable CS/CS/CS/HB 157 by Judiciary Committee, Justice Appropriations Subcommittee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Passidomo, Edwards, Harrell (Similar CS/SB 390)

Fraud; Defines "business entity"; provides for restitution for certain out-of-pocket costs of victims; requires business entities to provide copies of business records of fraudulent transactions involving identity theft to victims & law enforcement agencies in certain circumstances; provides exception; includes counties & other political subdivisions in provisions prohibiting false marking of goods or packaging with location of origin; prohibits fraudulent issuance of indicia of membership interest in limited liability company; specifies that electronic statements are included in provisions prohibiting certain false representations; prohibits sale of counterfeit security company signs or decals; increases criminal penalties for fraudulently obtaining goods or services from health care provider; expands specified identity theft offenses to include all persons rather than being limited to natural persons; prohibits knowingly providing false information that becomes part of public record to facilitate or further commission of certain offenses. Effective Date: October 1, 2015

CS/CS/CS/HB 175 by Judiciary Committee, Economic Development & Tourism Subcommittee, Civil Justice Subcommittee, Spano, Stone (Similar CS/CS/SB 222)

Electronic Commerce; Creates "Computer Abuse & Data Recovery Act"; prohibits person from intentionally committing specified acts without authorization with respect to protected computer; provides penalties for violation; specifies remedies for civil actions brought by persons affected by violation; provides that specified criminal judgments or decrees against defendant act as estoppel as to certain matters in specified civil actions; provides that specified civil actions must be filed within certain periods of time; provides that act does not prohibit specified activity by certain governmental agencies or impose liability on certain technology service providers. Effective Date: October 1, 2015

Civil Justice Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Economic Development & Tourism Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Judiciary Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

HB 193 by Broxson, Baxley, Harrell, Moskowitz, Peters, Rouson, Van Zant (Identical SB 164)

**Crime Stoppers Trust Fund;** Authorizes county that is awarded grant from trust fund to use such funds for purchase & distribution of promotional items. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Criminal Justice Subcommittee: Favorable; Justice Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Judiciary Committee: Favorable CS/CS/HB 209 by Finance & Tax Committee, Local Government Affairs Subcommittee, Artiles, Avila, Diaz, M., Drake, Eisnaugle (Similar CS/SB 668)

Emergency Fire Rescue Services & Facilities Surtax; Revises distribution of surtax proceeds; deletes provision requiring county governing authority to develop & execute interlocal agreements with local government entities providing emergency fire & rescue services; requires local government entity requesting & receiving certain personnel or equipment from another service provider to pay for such personnel or equipment from its share of surtax proceeds; provides for application of funds if local government entity receiving share of surtax is unable to further reduce ad valorem taxes; deletes provision requiring local government entities to enter into interlocal agreement in order to receive surtax proceeds. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

#### HB 213 by Moraitis (Identical SB 266)

**Property Appraisers;** Provides that property appraiser's budget shall be funded once DOR makes its final budget amendments; obligates county commission to fund DOR's final property appraiser budget during pendency of appeal to Administration Commission. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Finance & Tax Committee: Favorable; Local & Federal Affairs Committee: Favorable

CS/CS/HB 217 by Regulatory Affairs Committee, Business & Professions Subcommittee, Van Zant, Ahern, Geller, Plasencia, Rouson (Similar CS/SB 338)

Engineers; Prohibits person who is not licensed as engineer or structural engineer from using specified names & titles or practicing engineering or structural engineering; exempts certain persons from licensing requirements; establishes various fees for examination & licensure of structural engineers; provides licensure & application requirements for structural engineer license; exempts under certain conditions structural engineer who applies for licensure before specified date from passage of certain national examination; requires board to certify certain applicants for licensure by endorsement; prohibits specified persons from using specified names & titles; provides various acts which constitute grounds for disciplinary action against structural engineer, to which penalties apply. Effective Date: July 1, 2015

Business & Professions Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Regulatory Affairs Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

#### HB 221 by Drake (Identical SB 520)

**Long-Term Care Insurance;** Provides additional forms for mandatory offer of nonforfeiture benefits in long-term care insurance policies. Effective Date: July 1, 2015
