**Representative Edmonds Introduces Bill to Help Floridians Pay for Mortgages and Insurance**

**West Palm Beach, FL** – Florida State **Representative Jervonte Edmonds (D-West Palm Beach)** recently introduced [HB 41](#), a bill that would create a grant program to help Floridians pay for their mortgages and insurance. The bill would allocate millions for the program, which would be administered by the Department of Commerce.
