## **House Democrats Respond to BoE Sanctions**

**Tallahassee, Fla.** – Today, the <u>Florida Board of Education</u> voted to punish Florida school districts for standing against the Governor's orders and enforce mask requirements for students.

"I stand by the school districts, parents, principals, and teachers who are making endless sacrifices at great distances to keep our students and the community safe as we continue to navigate the pandemic in the school year. We must continue to do all we can to support their leadership, heroic acts, and ongoing support to provide Florida students with a safe, high-quality education," said **Representative Ramon Alexander (D- Tallahassee).**

Governor. I'm proud of the Alachua School Board for fighting to protect our kids. Because of safety measures like our mask requirements for students, Alachua's positivity rate is down to 4.7%."

The health and safety of their students is their highest priority; masks reduce viral spread and data from the CDC supports this strategy," said **Representative Robin Bartleman (D- Weston).**
