Statements by Florida House Democrats on the Assassination of President Jovenel Moïse

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – The assassination of **Haiti's President Jovenel Moïse** and the attack on **First Lady Martine Moïse** shocked Haiti and the rest of the world early Wednesday morning. Florida House Democrats issued the following statements in response to the heinous act.

"My deepest condolences go out to the people of Haiti, and especially to the family of President Jovenel Moïse and First Lady Martine Moïse. We will continue monitoring the news coming out of Haiti and stand with the people of Haiti, the Haitian diaspora in Florida and beyond," said **Co-Leader Bobby Dubose (D-Ft.Lauderdale)**.

"The assassination of the Haitian president should be unequivocally condemned, and those responsible should be brought to justice. I pray for peace and an end to the years of unrest that has disrupted the lives of the Haitian people, and also condemn the human rights violations endured by the people.
