## Homestead Exemption Bill for Seniors 65 and Older by State Representative Marie Woodson Passes the House Floor Unanimously

**TALLAHASSEE, Fla.** – **Representative Marie Woodson (D-Hollywood)'s** bill, <u>**HB 597**</u>, known as Homestead Exemption for Seniors 65 and Older, passed the House Floor with unanimous support.

The bill seeks to reduce the paperwork burden that low-income seniors 65 years and older face when renewing their qualified homestead exemption due to their income. Currently, low-income seniors must submit an affidavit and financial records stating their income on a yearly basis. **HB 597** changes that to an initial one-time filing and places a requirement that the beneficiary inform the property appraiser if their income status changes.

State **Senator Tina Polsky (D-Boca Raton)** sponsors **SB 1256**, which is the Senate companion bill to **HB 597**. This version has passed all three of its Senate Committee references with unanimous support and now heads to the Senate floor for a vote.
