**Representative Chambliss's Crime Stoppers Bill to Be Heard  
in its First Assigned Committee**

**TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Representative Kevin Chambliss (D-Homestead)** will have **HB 363**, Privileged Communications Made to Crime Stoppers Organizations, be heard in today's Criminal Justice and Public Safety Subcommittee meeting. The bill is the House companion to **SB 1868**, sponsored by **Senator and President Pro Tempore Aaron Bean (R-Jacksonville)**. This legislation will help further strengthen the organization, protect anonymous tipsters, and better aide law enforcement in closing open cases.

“Crime Stoppers is an organization that plays a pivotal part in the fight against gun violence in our communities,” said **Representative Kevin Chambliss**. “Protecting the anonymity of the tipsters and Crime Stoppers staff should be of the highest priority and I am proud to sponsor legislation that does just that.”
