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Representative Duran's HB 173 Passes in Early Learning & Elementary Education Subcommittee

Tallahassee, FL – Earlier today, [HB 173](#) passed with unanimous bipartisan support in the Early Learning & Elementary Education Subcommittee. **HB 173** standardizes measures for students with epilepsy or seizure disorders by allowing families to create and submit individualized seizure action plans (ISAP) to their schools, and also provides free online training for school employees relating to the care of students.

“This important piece of legislation will give parents peace of mind knowing that when their child is at school or attending a school-related function, staff will understand appropriate protocols in the event their student has a seizure. **HB 173** ensures students with epilepsy and seizure disorders receive appropriate care while attending school or school-related functions.
