Legislation Allow Educational Opportunities for Disabled Veterans Passes the Florida Legislature and Heads to Governor

Tallahassee, FL—Today, the Florida Senate unanimously passes **CS/HB 45**: **Educational Opportunities for Disabled Veterans**, filed by **Representative Daisy Morales (D-Orlando). Senator Janet Cruz (D-Tampa)** sponsored the companion bill in the Senate (**Senate Bill CS/SB554**). The legislation would allow those veterans who are deemed eligible the opportunity to receive a waiver for the remaining cost of tuition & fees at State Universities, Career Centers, Charter Technical Career Centers and Florida College System Institutions that they might not have covered by the federal GI Bill.
