## Representative Chambliss and Senator Torres File Driver's Licenses and Identification Cards Bill

**TALLAHASSEE, Fla.** – Earlier this week **Representative Kevin Chambliss (D-Homestead)** and **Senator Victor Torres (D-Orlando)** filed <u>House Bill 1639</u> **Driver Licenses and Identification Cards** and <u>Senate Bill 866</u>. It's important that we acknowledge that our immigrant neighbors are valuable members of our community, and, here, they are welcome," said **Representative Chambliss**

This is a nobrainer that allows willing individuals to safely contribute and participate in our society", said **Senator Torres Jr.**
